When I founded OCS over 16 years ago, I never could have imagined the reach we have as an organization today. Since 2009, over 250,000 new enlistees have been honored at Enlistee Recognition Ceremonies across 32 states and territories. We have also welcomed nearly half a million other attendees to our ceremonies, including parents and family members of new enlistees, business and community leaders, veterans, military officers and elected officials. This year, we achieved double-digit growth in the number of ceremonies we were able to offer.

OCS remains alongside new enlistees and their families through every step of their military journey. OCS Connect[™] was created to share supportive resources designed to empower enlistees and military families with education and career opportunities, financial planning, podcasts, learning modules, and community-focused events. I am proud that we serve as a trusted resource to provide this critical information.

Reconnecting American communities to our nation's military is central to our purpose. Initiatives such as the OCS Virtual Thank You Card, our STEM and General Colin Powell Memorial Service Awards, and our Veteran Serving Organizations and corporate partnerships are all examples of how we are working with this purpose.

All of the accomplishments you are about to read in the following pages would not have been possible without those who have joined in on our mission. There is only one thing I can say - thank you. Thank you to our donors, volunteers, community leaders, staff, and everyone else who has touched our organization in even the smallest of ways. Your support is invaluable.

Our country is facing an unprecedented crossroad, as fewer and fewer young adults are making the decision to serve their country in uniform.

I served in the United States Army for nearly 40 years. I commanded units from platoon to corps, and culminated my career as the Deputy Chief of Staff of the Army, where I was responsible for Soldiers deployed in 140 countries as well as supporting all emergency operations in the U.S., including relief efforts for disasters such as Hurricanes Irma, Maria and Florence. I have led successful military and civilian operations on four continents, where we built positive and effective relationships with local constituencies, international government leaders, heads of state on three continents, and senior military and diplomatic teams. I worked in nation-building in two countries, dealing with everything from infrastructure and healthcare, to banking systems. I also served as the Commanding General of the XVIII Airborne Corps at Fort Bragg, NC, as well as the Commander of the International Security Assistance Force Joint Command, a coalition of 48 nations, as part of Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan.

I am not listing my accolades to be vaunt, but rather to share the incredible opportunities the United States Military has provided me, and to emphasize the pride I take in my service. Every person who puts on a uniform and makes the selfless decision to serve our great Nation deserves to not only be recognized, but supported by the communities they are risking their lives to protect.

Serving as the Chairman of the OCS board is not a role I take lightly. We have an important job to do, and I am honored to help do it. Despite the current challenges facing our Nation and military recruiting, I am confident the future of our country is bright.





Relative to preparing the enlistee for military service, the ceremony was:








DAUGHTER OF THE HIGH CHIEF

The Fraiai family has a long legacy of military service.

Delexis' father is a U.S. Army veteran, and Purple Heart recipient who served 18 years. Her father's uncle was an Army Black Hawk pilot, with other members of their family serving in the United States Air Force, U.S. Marine Corps, and law enforcement. She first heard about the OCS Enlistee Recognition Program from her mother. She said of the experience, "It left me feeling very proud of myself." She commented on



how she has been inspired by her father's accomplishments, and what the members of her family have all gained from their service. When her father was injured, she was touched by the outpouring of support from the community. She also admires her mother's ability to adapt to change. "Even though my dad was on the other side of the world, she remained strong." She said she was a great role model for her having the responsibility of all of the children while her father underwent five deployments and multiple trainings. "One of the things I admire most about my father is his perseverance. He didn't choose an easy Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) – always being one of the first on the line, and putting everyone before himself." That is a quality she said she hopes to emulate. The family celebrates their Samoan culture. The headdress symbolizes "Daughter of the High Chief" and is used to celebrate milestones. What does her father want for her? "I want her to be the best she can be in whatever she chooses to do. I tell her – **don't forget where you come from to know where you are going."**

OCS EDUCATOR AWARDS

High school guidance counselors and teachers are key to a military recruiter's ability to meet with high school students who may be interested in military career opportunities. To help strengthen the important relationship, OCS Awards enable recruiters to nominate local guidance counselors for the General Colin Powell Memorial Service Award, and to nominate high school teachers for the OCS STEM Award.

Award recipients are honored at OCS Ceremonies, along with family members and colleagues. OCS Awards are the only such recognition program that have a direct and long-term impact on military recruiting.





OCS GUIDEBOOK: WHY WE TAKE THE OATH: AN ESSENTIAL GUIDE TO OUR FOUNDING DOCUMENTS

Each and every high school senior who is honored at an OCS Ceremony receives a 96-page guidebook, specially-written for OCS new enlistees, that begins to educate them on our nation's founding principles that they have sworn a sacred oath to protect and defend...lessons that too few new enlistees were taught during their school years...



CORPORATE-HOSTED CEREMONIES

OCS embarked on a first-of-its-kind, pilot initiative with a new ceremony model to recognize older enlistees (beyond high school graduation). Honoring these enlistees becomes essential, as military recruiting expands its reach to community college students to address the declining number of high school graduates.

OCS partnered with **PayPal SERVE Veteran Employee Resource Group**, to sponsor and host a corporate OCS ceremony at its PayPal global headquarters in San Jose, California.

Sixty enlistees from the San Jose area were recognized in front of a crowd of almost 200 family members, recruiters and PayPal employees. This event was also live-streamed to other PayPal sites around the country.

75% of enlisted service members will only serve 48 months. When they exit service, they bring a high-quality and diverse set of skills to the workforce. This unique event allowed enlistees to network with veterans and employees of a multinational corporation headquartered in their hometown.

Multiple corporate-hosted OCS Ceremonies are planned for 2024 and 2025.

OCS CONNECT



OCS Connect is a free, online initiative designed to provide our nation's newest service members, and their parents/guardians, the advice and resources needed to navigate their military journey.

OCS Connect provides guidance on the earliest steps of the military journey, such as a basic military training and essential life skills, to assisting with early college and post-military career planning. It is imperative to begin education, career, and financial planning as soon as enlistees begin their service.
